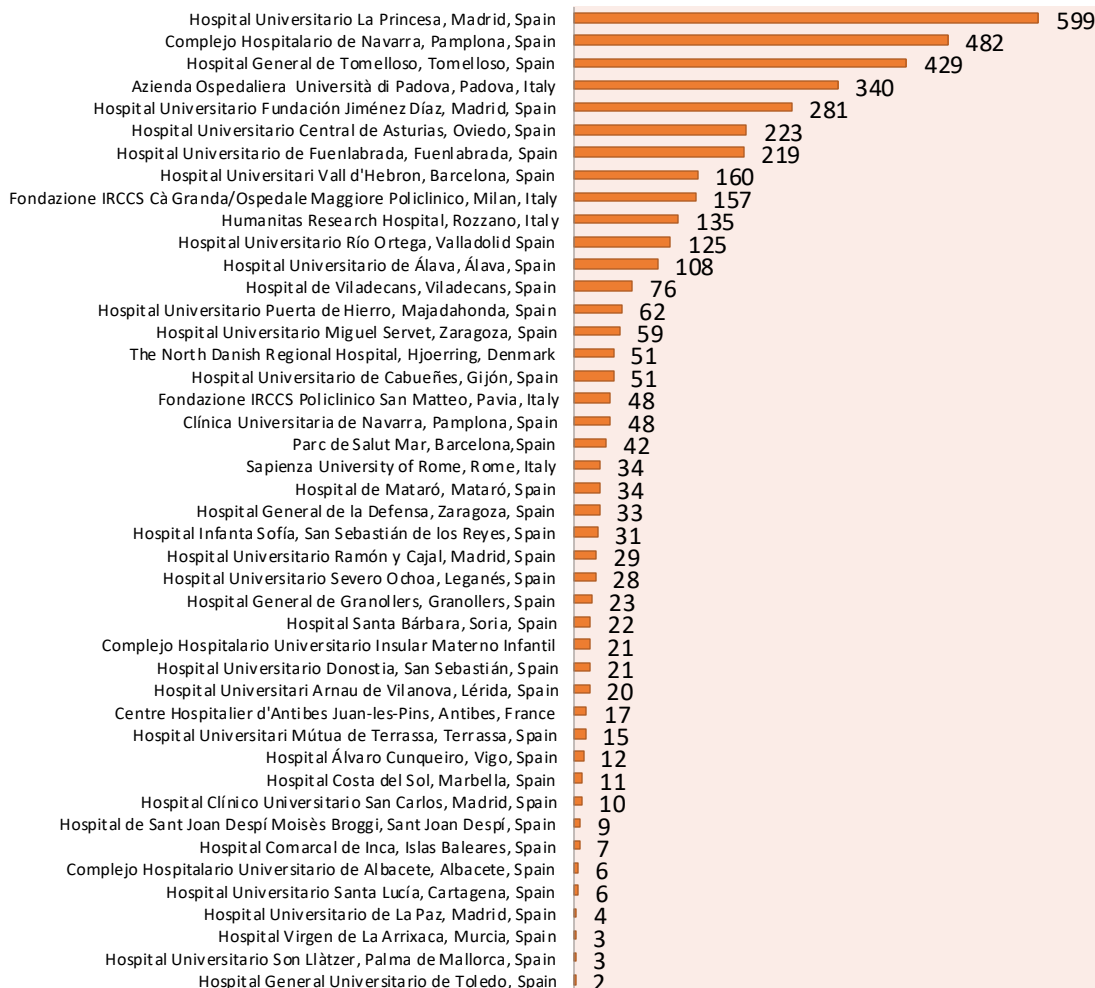

Changes implemented in the EoE CONNECT database

Food allergy is the most common atopic manifestation in patients with EoE. In order to improve the collection of higher-quality data on food allergies the "concomitant atopic diseases" tab has been updated in EoE CONNECT to capture accurate information. The recent update reads as follows:

The new "food allergy" section is now located together in the same place of other atopic conditions that may be present in each patient.

EoE patients may have allergies to several foods, and each of them could cause different symptoms. For example, a hypothetical patient could present an anaphylaxis to peanuts and also an oral allergy syndrome by peach. The database now allows you to register the different foods that cause allergy to each patient, separated and with detailed information on the manifestations they produce, the age of onset, details about the diagnosis and the possible treatment performed.
