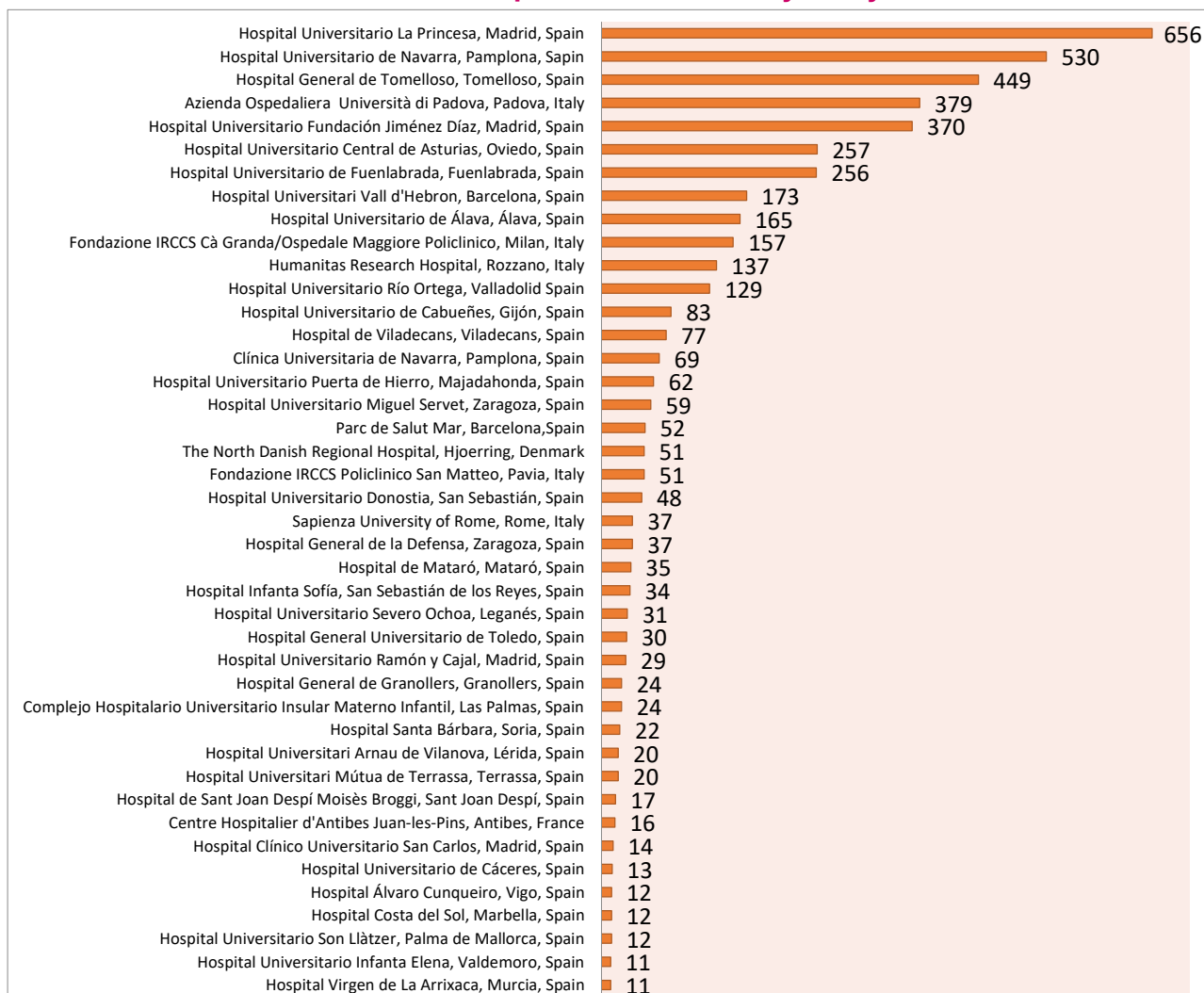

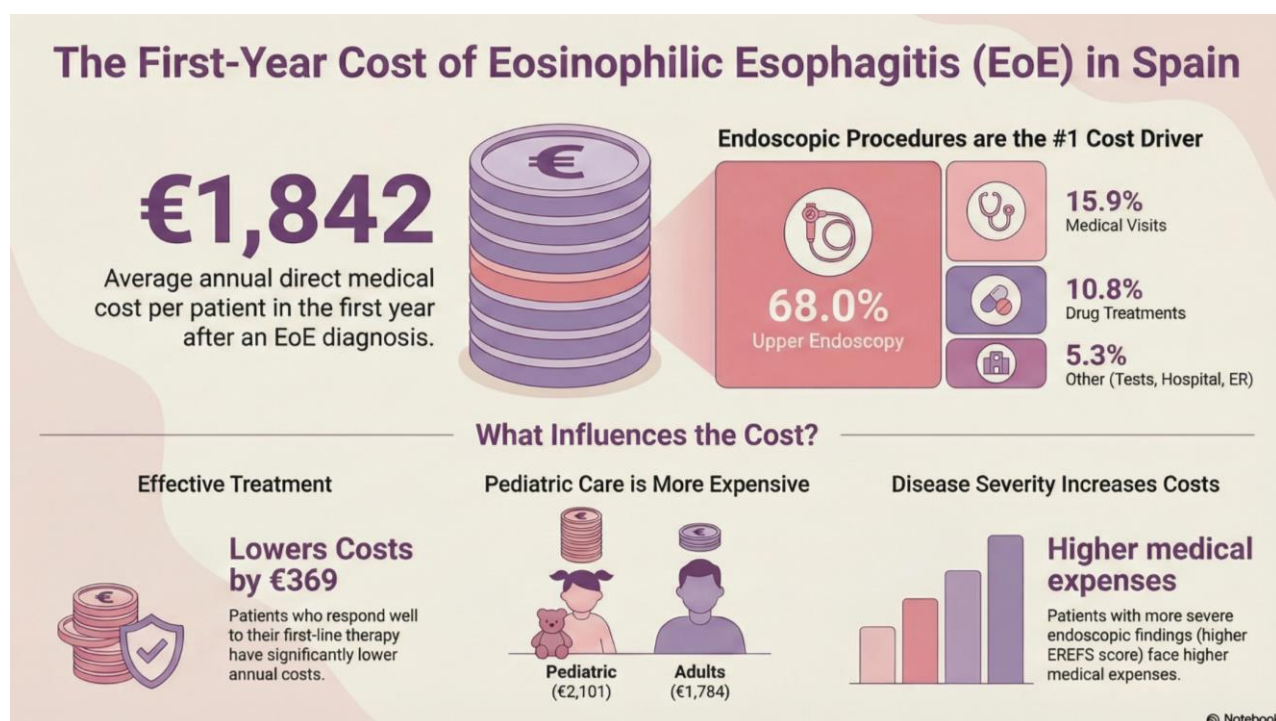
EoE CONNECT Recruitment Status at December 25 (n=4,729)

New article based on data from the EOE CONNECT registry recently published: Economic burden of eosinophilic esophagitis in the first year after diagnosis in Spain: A direct medical cost

The European Journal of Health Economics recently published a study on the direct medical costs determined by eosinophilic esophagitis in Spain during the first year after diagnosis (Observational study, n=302, 2017-2018 period)



• Factors increasing direct costs

Pediatric patients: Pediatric care costs €317.22 more per patient than adult care, likely related to increased use of resources around endoscopy, which includes anesthesia and post-procedure recovery care.

Higher disease severity: Associated with an additional €184.88 per patient, due to increased use of endoscopies and more intensive treatments.

High-volume recruitment site: An increase of €217.56 per patient, explained by the higher proportion of pediatric patients treated in these centers and the greater number of endoscopies performed per patient.

• Factor decreasing direct costs

Early Response to First-Line Treatment: This factor reduces total direct costs by €368.95 per patient and is the most influential cost-saving determinant. The reduction is mainly due to avoiding additional medical procedures, particularly fewer non-urgent endoscopies (−€255.32).
